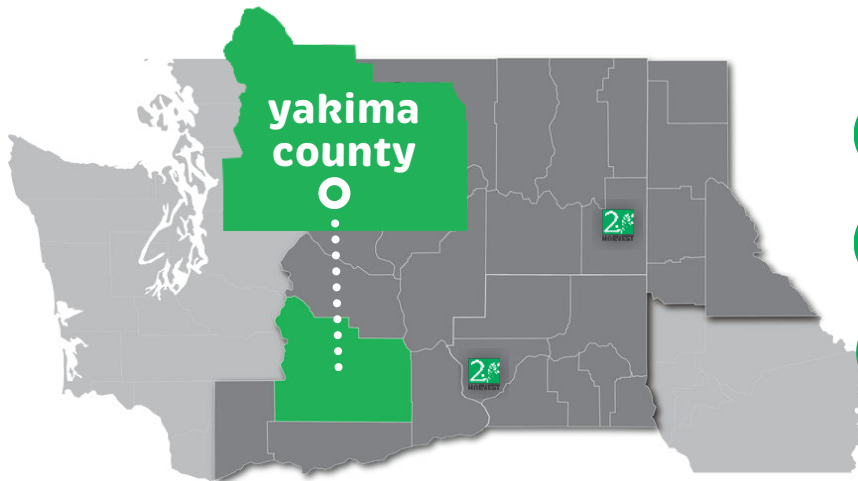
how you help

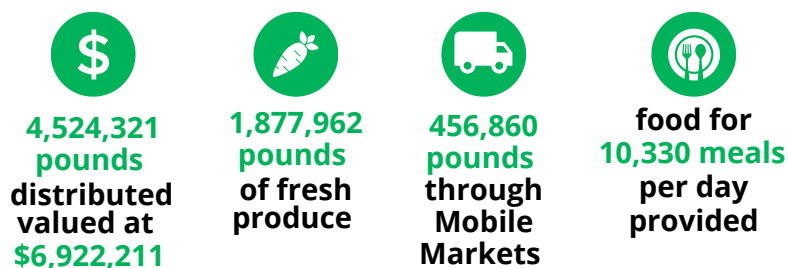
